AireCanada Can Help!



Sometimes, with the best will in the world, owners simply cannot keep that pup they so happily purchased last year or several years ago. A job may have been lost or a transfer to a dog-unfriendly city may have occurred. Perhaps the addition of children to a household has left little time for the family Airedale. The owner could have developed an unexpected illness that precludes his or her ability to look after the dog. A myriad of reasons can account for an Airedale losing his or her home.

AireCanada applauds the fact that many breeders are supportive of the Airedales they breed for the dog's entire life. Of course, this support may, occasionally, mean that an adult dog is returned to these breeders. Since most breeders maintain lists of people wanting to buy puppies, they frequently do not have available homes for older animals. If you have a return and are at a loss for a suitable home, please contact your nearest AireCanada Coordinator.

AireCanada has assisted numerous breeders to find homes for such dogs. Go to our website, www.airecanada.com, to click on the Contact Us information. We will do our best to help you. (Note, though, that we are unable to help you sell your dog . . . only to place the Airedale in a good home. Most breeders who take advantage of this service ask the adoptive home to donate a nominal sum to AireCanada to help us continue our work.)

It's all About Cooperation: a Bittersweet Rescue



Two year old Buddy came to AireCanada's attention when National Airedale Rescue in the US alerted us to a Kijiji advertisement offering an Airedale "free to a good home" several hundred miles from Vancouver. Upon investigation, it appeared the owner was desperate to find a situation for her dog who would otherwise be shot for running game. Her property, of course, lacked fencing. She refused to deal with AireCanada, however, as she felt rescue was only for "abused"

dogs" and her dog was not abused.

Wanting to ensure Buddy's safety, we got very busy. Several of our volunteers were enlisted as well as a woman in the area who had recently adopted an Airedale from us. I became involved as well despite being way out of the area where the dog was located. The final result of some very hard work by a number of dedicated Airedale people was the discovery of an excellent family with three older children and a female Airedale. They stepped up to the plate to save Buddy's life. Just before Christmas, Dad drove a considerable distance to collect Buddy. He brought him home and the entire family fell in love with this gentle giant.

Buddy had a splendid Christmas. Instead of a bullet to the head, his Christmas gift was an appeal to AireCanada by the family to adopt Buddy.

Then came the bad news. A visit to the vet resulted in a diagnosis of serious heart disease. Buddy had a major heart murmur and a thinning of his heart wall.

On Feb. 15, Buddy's heart failed and he crossed the Rainbow Bridge in the arms of the oldest child, his best "Buddy".

Buddy's new family has a lot of class: despite mourning Buddy deeply, they still found room in their hearts to thank AireCanada for asking them to save Buddy. Buddy, they say, came to live with them for a short time for a purpose. They have asked for another Airedale when one becomes available. . . . and one did! Puppy Teddy, who arrived in rescue this summer, is now enjoying life with this fine family!

Safe & Happy!

Since Aug. 1, 2009, 38 Airedales have found safe and happy homes as a result of AireCanada's work., 13 more than during the previous year.

Each of these dogs required veterinary care (some costly and extensive), microchipping and other services. Donations to help us continue bringing Airedales such as these 38 to safe, happy

homes are always welcome. We applaud nine year old Ray Matthews of Calgary who requested donations to AireCanada rather than gifts to celebrate his birthday this year. He raised \$70 to help rescued Airedales!

Ginette Miron of Princedale Kennels has given us a couple of recipes for doggie biscuits.

Homemade dog cookies

Cheddar Biscuits
2 cups flour
1 T baking powder
1/2 tsp. salt
1 1/2 cups grated cheddar
1 1/2 cups heavy cream Mix,
Bake 17 minutes at 425 F.

K-9 Peanut Butter Cookies
1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
1 T baking powder
1 cup milk
1/2 cup flour
1 cup Peanut butter

Mix with hands, roll out on floured surface.

Cut into tasty shapes. Bake 350 F 20-25 minutes

CHEESE COOKIES
2 cups flour
1 1/2 Shredded Cheddar cheese
1/4 t garlic powder
1/2 c veg oil
5 T water
2 eggs
Mix and cut into tasty shapes.
Bake at 400F for 15 minutes.

Dog Biscuits 3/4 cup powdered skim milk 1/2 cup cornmeal 1/4 cup bulgur (bulghur) wheat 2-1/4 cups whole wheat flour

1 chicken bouillon cube
1-1/2 cups boiling water
1 cup rolled oats
1 egg, beaten
Combine powdered skim milk, cornmeal,
bulgur and flour and set aside.

In large mixing bowl, dissolve bouillon cube in boiling water. Add oats and let stand about 5 minutes. Stir in beaten egg.

Gradually stir in dry ingredients, half a cup at a time, until well blended. The last few cupfuls, blend with your hands. (note: if you have a good stand mixer, you can just use that and it works just as well)

Divide dough into 2 balls so it is easy to work with.

Knead each doug ball on a floured surface about 5 minutes. (see note above - if you have a good stand mixer, just knead with it.)

With a rolling pin, roll dough to 1/4 to 1/2 inch thickness. Cut into desired shape and place on baking sheet lined with parchment paper. (note: do not use foil - biscuits will burn!)

Bake 50-60 minutes at 325 degrees. Turn oven off and let biscuits cool overnight in the oven. I usually check them; if not hard enough, leave them all day, and they should be hard enough after that.

Be sure biscuits are completely cool before storing. Store at room temperature in a glass or ceramic jar with a loose fitting lid. They should keep about 3 weeks, but since they do not have any preservatives, check to be sure they are not moldy

They also can be refrigerated or frozen. Enjoy!!
